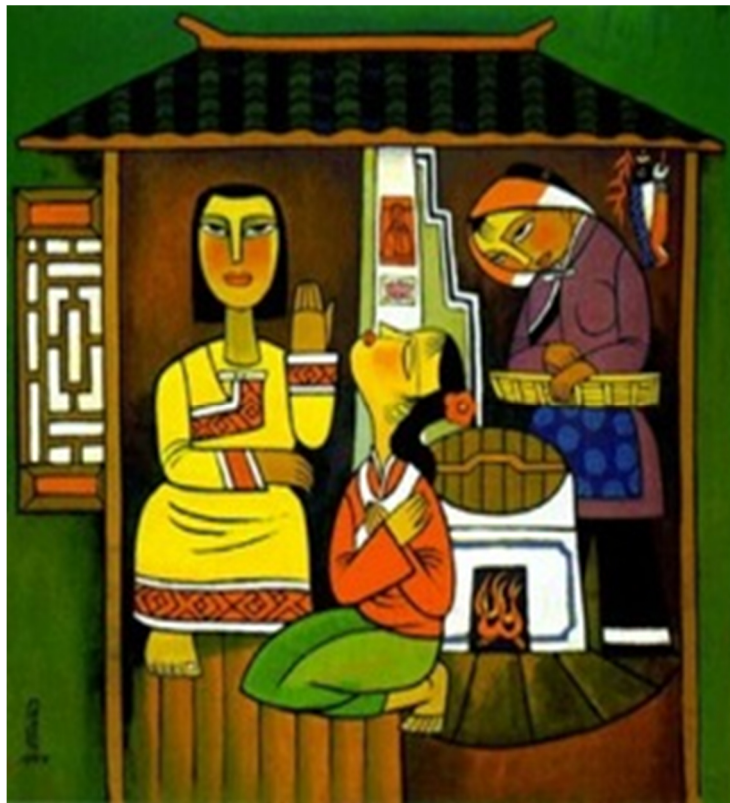


Prayer of Praise (Unison)




