

Call to a Congregational Meeting of the Governing Body of The Congregational Church of West Medford, United Church of Christ Sunday, November 24, 2013 (11:30 am—1:30 pm)

The Officers and Church Council of the Congregational Church of West Medford issue this call to a Congregational Meeting to:

1. Vote to Authorize the Church Council to engage the contracted services of a Real Estate Broker to create a market for the sale of all or a major portion of the congregation's property at 400 High Street; to: a) determine the actual range of financial, ministry and building use options that a sale of the property might provide; and b) to develop and propose to the Congregation for their review and approval the option(s) regarding this property that would best serve the Congregation's mission as determined by the Congregation in the continuing Crossroads Process.

NOTE: The Church Council has delegated responsibilities for this research on the potential sale of the congregation's property to the ad hoc Strategic Planning Team (SPT) appointed by the Moderator and consisting of Rich Carle, Phil DiScullo, Bruce Roberts, Paul Roberts, Kathy Williams and Rev. Wendy Miller Olapade (with Max Beal serving as consultant). The SPT will report back to the Council on the options and any possible recommendation(s). The Council must review and approve any option recommendation(s) and submit it (them) to the Congregation for its approval.

2. Discuss other new business as brought forth by the Strategic Planning Team and/or members and friends of the congregation.
