

Oh, Great Spirit
Whose voice I hear in the winds,
And whose breath gives life to all the world,
as I come before You, one of Your many children
hear me, I am small and weak,
I need your strength and wisdom

Let me walk in beauty and make my eyes ever behold
the red and purple sunset.

Make my hands respect the things you have
made and my ears sharp to hear your voice.

Make me wise so that I may understand the things
you have taught my people.

Let me learn the lessons you have
hidden in every leaf and rock.

I seek strength, not to be greater than my brother, but to fight my greatest enemy - myself.

Make me always ready to come to you with clean hands and straight eyes.

So when life fades, as the fading sunset, my Spirit may come to you without shame.

As brightly as the story's star, the Epiphany opens up the stellar power of God's coming to humanity, and our awkward, dramatic, unlikely fumbling toward the Divine. We see the rewards of leaving the comfort zone of one's own faith and of interfaith cooperation, the penalties for missing the signs of other seekers, and the ways all of us are Herod, all of us are the magi, and all of us long for power. As we ponder what gifts the Epiphany lays at our feet this year, perhaps we will consider what sorts of power we seek, and how we might be sure we do not fail to see the signs of God's new life born among us.
