
Ministry Center Open House and Blessing of the Back Packs With CWS School Kits for Kids—Service Project, Ice Cream Social & Networking for "FormingFaith.net"

We are planning an open house and our first new ministry center moment during the first week of school! We will invite families all over Medford to collect items for CWS School Kits and ask them to bring their donations to our ministry center over the course of an afternoon where kids will have a chance to "build a kit", craft a note to include in the kit (we will send them to CWS); have their own backpacks, laptops, tablets and school year blessed and share in an 'Ice Cream Social'.

This will also be an opportunity to network and connect with families and share our Faith Formation in the Home Ministry which you can now see online at www.FormingFaith.net.

To assemble a CWS School Kit you will need:

- One pair of blunt metal scissors (rounded tip)
- Three 70-count spiral notebooks or notebooks totaling 200-210 pages (no loose-leaf or filler paper)
- One 30-centimeter ruler (12")
- One hand-held pencil sharpener
- One large eraser
- Six new pencils with erasers
- One box of 24 crayons (only 24)
- One 12" x 14" to 14" x 17" finished size cotton or lightweight canvas bag with cloth handles.
 (Please, no reusable shopping bags or backpacks.)
- Pack all items inside the cloth bag (pattern for bag is on website)
