# A REFLECTION FROM Dr. HERMAN WEISS, ORGANIST AND CHOIR DIRECTOR REPRINTED FROM MAY, 2014

#### Dear Friends,

At such an important time in the church's history [I wanted to convey a few thoughts about our time together]. I could concoct a list of the many wonderful musical events which we shared (not to mention so many other Sundays and Thursdays [like this past Holy Week]) but - you were there, so you know. If you ever need a tangible reminder let me know - I have it all on CD and/or DVD.

What I do want to express is my total gratitude for making me 'look good' for so many years. Making music in a church setting is about sharing, inspiring and creating fellowship. In each of these areas I consider the music program of CCWM to have been a resounding success. Your willingness to bring a spiritual connection through music to the congregation has been the one constant in the church's life during my time at CCWM. The list of [things to celebration] is long:

- 1. Working tirelessly to integrate yourselves into a choir led by some of the most wonderful professional musicians and then later continuing to maintain a high standard of excellence.
- 2. Displaying the patience to grow your musicianship skills. I have watched while so many of you have branched out into the greater musical community and inspired others to do the same.
- 3. Bringing music to the larger community such as the Messiah Sings with orchestra, performing Godspell and our Christmas programs in facilities in Medford and Winchester.
- 4. Helping and encouraging the youth of CCWM to build a program based in the Church School, resulting in many musical presentations on biblical themes ('100 Percent Chance of Rain', 'Jonah', 'Godspell', 'A Ceremony of Carols', 'Once Upon a Night', 'Once Upon a Tree', plus numerous

- anthems and service music). The youth musical program was enormously important in bringing musical involvement to church families and in the growth and maturation of the young people within the church. Integrating young singers into the adult choir happened almost seamlessly and they assumed a leadership role within the choir.
- Ministerial support: We have been blessed by the support and leadership of our ministers who, although different in their styles and personalities, have been constant in their support of the CCWM music program.
- 6. Musical Instruments: we have been fortunate to be able to purchase an excellent grand piano for the Sanctuary, largely due to the church's recognition of the importance of engaging the congregation and supporting the effectiveness of the music. The [historic] organ has been well maintained and has had important repairs as needed.

CCWM has been a musical church for many decades. The Church has seen many changes in that time. Music has been the glue that connects the present to the past and makes the future possible. At this pivotal moment for CCWM it is important to celebrate that which is good and positive while engaging the future.
