B. A Word about "Who is our Neighbor?"

We need to discern answers to these questions—who is out there (Mosaic Segments), who is attracted to what we are doing, what are the implications of that for our sustainability, if we want to attract other segments—what does that mean for our ministry model?

# II. Functions, Staffing and Leadership for Sustainability – What, Who, How: 2018 and beyond... With Transition Comes Opportunity!

### A. Current Status

- At current projections for market and spending, with no additional revenue we will spend down assets to approximately \$2M by year end 2019.
- 2. Sustainability is everything!
- 3. We are Learning from our Experiment and Experience
- 4. Reduce Pastoral Staff—non-renewal of Community Minister Contract
- 2. Resignation of Church Administrator
- 3. Several Leadership Circle Members will Complete their Service—including the Treasurer
- B. What and Who and How: 2018 and beyond... Now that we have three years of experience!! What are the Essential Functions and Staffing/Leadership structure and skills needed to achieve sustainability
  - Pastoral/Clergy Functions
  - Church/Business Management and Administrative Functions
  - Accounting/Bookkeeping Functions
  - Marketing/Social Media Functions
  - Development Fundraising Functions
    - —Grants/Investors/Sustainers (external fundraising)
    - —Stewardship (internal giving)
  - Community Organizing Functions
  - Leading, Inspiring, Organizing Ministry Functions—Lay Leadership. Volunteerism, Passion for the Purpose and more...

# III. Getting to an organizational structure for mission and sustainability – Bylaws and Leadership Development

The Leadership Circle is recommending changes to our bylaws to include (but not limited to)

- Eliminate the Stewardship and Finance 'Standing Committee' with the roles and responsibilities identified therein, to be assumed by the Leadership Circle;
- Allow for community members who are invested in Sanctuary's mission and
  who bring specific skills and experiences needed by the new model of ministry
  into which we are living—to serve on the Leadership Circle. The recommended
  change would include protections to the financial well being (background checks
  for instant) and require a minimum percentage of LC to be members of the congregation

### **Big Picture Recommendation**

Continue to tighten our ministry model

Laser-like focus on volunteer development

Continue to develop and live into partnerships

Seek contract expertise that does not exist in our current staffing model le: bookkeeping, marketing, social media, financial development.

As we would were we a new church start—
Recruit Community Members with broad expertise
who are invested in Sanctuary's success to the Leadership Circle

### **Short Term Recommendation**

Hire Bonded Bookkeeping Agency for Treasurer and Admin financials

Hire Interim Church/Office Administrator

Recruit a strategic discernment and search team (including folk from outside of the church) for consideration of staffing and skills/expertise adjustments and hiring.
