For Reflection

As you gather for worship this morning, imagine yourself in a crowd of people waiting to catch a glimpse of a well-known public figure. Is it Archbishop Desmond Tutu? President Barack Obama? a favourite movie star? a national hero? David Ortiz?

People around you shift and press against you in an attempt to reach a prime location for photographs and a chance handshake. If you were a child, you could climb on an adult's shoulders for a better look.

You wait with great anticipation, wondering if this person will measure up to your expectations; wondering how an encounter with this one might leave you both changed.

The story of Zacchaeus embodies expectation, anticipation, and transformation. The tree branch in our worship center today symbolizes the gathering of community in worship, a time when we expect to encounter the Holy in and around us.

As you arrive this morning, I invite you to write your name on the paper hand in the bulletin and come forward to hang it on a branch.
