CALL TO MEETING

The SNEUCC Behavioral Covenant

- **Speak for Self.** Share from our individual perspectives, avoiding statements like, "everybody knows..." or "I think we can all agree..." and, "Some people are saying...".
- Share the Air. Pay attention to how much time/space we take. If we have spoken already, or someone else has given voice to our viewpoint, we will consider making room for others. If we have remained silent, we will consider sharing our perspective.
- Communicate with Care. Choose words that are respectful and inclusive. Use language to build up,
 not break down. Attend to the impact of our words and actions, and when harm is identified, we will
 listen and respond with care and respect.
- **Turn to Wonder.** If we find ourselves inclined to make a snap judgement or dismiss another person's perspective, we will get curious. We will wonder (or ask) why they think the way they do and be open to what we might have to learn from one another.
- **Lean on Spirit.** Remember that God is present in our conversation and be intentional about listening for that voice. We will presume the best in the intentions of others.

BACKGROUND

- 2020.01.11 All-Church Listening Session: Collective Call for a Deep Consideration of the Sanctuary Experiment; <u>Meeting Minutes</u>
- Feb: LC Voted to put together a Discernment Team
 - Invitation to all members and partners asking for volunteers
 - All who volunteered or agreed are members of the Discernment Team;
 sought to reflect long time and new members, and LC
- Feb/March: Discernment Team begins to research approaches to discernment, consultants to lead, and context for The Church as an institution
- March 2020: Pandemic Shutdown with Community-Wide Pause to Pivot

BACKGROUND, CONTINUED

- April/May LC/Discernment Team: Meets to Pray and Discern a Way Forward
- <u>2020.05.31 Minutes</u> Special Congregational Meeting Votes to Extend Budget, Leadership, and Cong. Meeting Obligations by 6 months
- June, July, August Discernment Team Practices Contemplative Prayer
- Discernment Team's and Church's Pandemic Experience Leads to Proposal for Congregational Discernment through June 2021(as proposed today)

CONTEXT THAT LED TO DISCERNMENT TEAM'S PROPOSAL

- Considerations (both post-modern & post-pandemic)
 - Sanctuary (like all institutions) is in A Liminal Time between what was and what is to unfold (between Crossroads and the Future)
 - Liminality is a really hard place for human beings to be
 - Guidance from UCC there is no going back. The change in ministry models will continue to unfold and will be "permanent"
 - Pandemic Worship has been successful Hillside partnership and joint worship is inpirational, affirming, both classic and new, all generations
 - Success of Ministry Response to New Need: Food Ministry; Racial Reckoning; Equitable Response to Remote School
 - New Normal Unknown New Needs will continue long after vaccine

RECOMMENDATION FOR A DIFFERENT MODEL IN THIS CONTEXT

Make a conscious move from Decision Making to Discernment

Three translations/versions of the same Psalm

First Reading

Each identifies and shares the word or phrase that catches their attention (no discussion)

Second Reading

Each identifies
and shares where
this passage
touches their life
today
(no discussion)

Third Reading

I've heard and shared, what do I believe God wants our church to do or be? Is God inviting Sanctuary to change in any way?"

(no discussion)

Close with each Praying for the next one in the prayer circle; conclude with The Lord's Prayer and brief period of silence

CURRENT PROPOSAL - APPROVED BY LC IN AUGUST

- Fall 2020 Use 2020 Annual Visioning Meeting to Begin Discernment about the <u>success of the experiment</u> and the <u>future of Sanctuary</u>
 - 09/27 10/24: Phase 1, Part 1: Looking Up to God
 - 10/25 11/29: Phase 1, Part 2: Looking Out to Community
- Dec. 06: 2020 Annual Congregational Meeting to Extend Budget, Ministry, and Leadership "as Is" through Fiscal Year (date tentative)
- Winter/Spring, Discernment Continues into Annual Visioning 2021
 - Models for these phases to be determined, but prayer continues
 - Phase 3: Looking Inward God's Vision for Sanctuary
 - Phase 4: Next Steps Carrying Out God's Vision/Developing Sanctuary
 Mission and Ministry in response to discernment and the new context
- June, 2021: Annual Congregational Meeting (Ministry Plan, Budget, Leadership)

This discernment process leads us to a deeper dive about our purpose/call (Vision and Mission) as a church - taking the time to listen to God; especially in the midst of this time of uncertainty and pandemic.
