Dear Sanctuary,

We helped feed our neighbors and found new ways to share our love. It wasn't perfect but it was enough. Today, at the outdoor service it was wonderful to see so many faces in person after sharing so much together, apart. I teared up during the Lord's prayer because I had know idea how much I had missed praying out loud with others.

Last night I babysat for a friend and did not get home until 1:30 am. This morning as I was hurrying to get ready I remembered it was a potluck. Knowing I did not have enough time to get ready and bring food I was reminded by something my Mammie told me at church right before a potluck. She said the potluck is an important part of church because it reminds us that there is always enough. Sometimes you are in a place where you can bring more and in those moments you need to do so by bringing something big like pulled pork, or a pasta dish. At other moments you need to just do your best even if that is yogurt, fruit or store bought salad. Then she paused and said other times you need to remember that others will take care of you so even when you have nothing it is important to still come, so your friends and family can fill you up and you can be humbled by God's love. Today I was humbled and reminded that there will always be enough as long as you show up and trust in your community. On my way home today her story brought to mind Matthew 6 26-34, New LIving Translation.

And why worry about your clothing? Look at the lilies of the field and how they grow. They don't work or make their clothing, yet Solomon in all his glory was not dressed as beautifully as they are. So don't worry about these things, saying, 'What will we eat? What will we drink? What will we wear?'
